

face2face Intermediate: Common European Framework (CEF) B1 and B2 Skills Maps

The table on the right describes the general degree of skill required at B1 of the CEF. Details of the language knowledge required for B1 are listed in *Threshold 1990*. The 'can do' statements for B1 are listed in the *Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, teaching, assessment.*

face2face Intermediate completes B1, which students started in **face2face** Pre-intermediate. The Listening, Reading, Speaking and Writing maps which follow show where the required competences for B1 are covered in **face2face** Intermediate.

face2face Intermediate also takes students into B2, which they will complete in face2face Upper Intermediate. The 'can do' statements from B2 that are covered in face2face Intermediate are indicated by an asterisk (*) in the maps which follow.

U N D E R	Listening	I can understand the main points of clear standard speech on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. I can understand the main point of many radio or TV programmes on current affairs or topics of personal or professional interest when the delivery is relatively slow and clear.
S T A N D I N G	Reading	I can understand texts that consist mainly of high frequency everyday or job-related language. I can understand the description of events, feelings and wishes in personal letters.
S P E	Spoken interaction	I can deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken. I can enter unprepared into conversation on topics that are familiar, of personal interest or pertinent to everyday life (e.g. family, hobbies, work, travel and current events).
A K I N G	Spoken Production	I can connect phrases in a simple way in order to describe experiences and events, my dreams, hopes and ambitions. I can briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans. I can narrate a story or relate the plot of a book or film and describe my reactions.
W R I T I S	Writing	I can write simple connected texts on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. I can write personal letters describing experiences and impressions.
